Principal's Message

Clearspring Middle School is thrilled to be starting our third year! We have assembled a fantastic staff of teachers, EAs, secretaries, librarians and custodians, and we are ready to get started on providing a first-rate education to every student in our school. Over the past two years, we have learned about the concept of a *growth mindset* with our staff, and this year we are making a commitment to being a Growth Mindset School. One of the most basic beliefs we carry about ourselves has to do with how we view and inhabit what we consider our personality (Carol Dweck, *Mindset; The New Psychology of Success*). A growth mindset thrives on challenge and sees failure not as evidence of low intelligence, but as a heartening springboard for growth and for stretching our abilities. According to Dweck, what makes the growth mindset so powerful is that **"it creates a passion for learning rather than a hunger for approval"**. The opposite of a growth mindset is a fixed mindset. Those with a fixed mindset avoid challenge, give up easily, are easily frustrated, and ignore feedback or criticism. Those with a fixed mindset desire to be seen as perfect and talented, whereas those with a growth mindset **desire to learn and to improve**. Our school is committed to promoting a growth mindset in all our students. We will praise EFFORT, not ABILITY. We will encourage risk (which means some failure), and see risk and failure as learning opportunities. All of our work with students will reflect this commitment.

Clearspring Middle School has made a strong commitment to being the best middle school we

can be. We use as our guide sixteen characteristics of a successful middle school as outlined by the Association of Middle Level Educators (AMLE). These traits are on our website, and we consider them in all our planning at CMS. In addition to that, we have made a promise to our community, which is printed elsewhere in this newsletter. We intend to keep our promise, and invite parents to engage with us as we seek to help all students learn at the highest levels possible.

We have some great news about our playground – we will be using it this year! That means that our students will need to learn some new habits, but we are pleased that we can begin to build a healthy playground culture at school. We are also going to return to a single, common, lunch hour. That means that all of our students will eat their lunch from 11:49 – 12:14, after which we will begin intramurals, noon activities, and outdoor play.

Each student receives a Student Handbook from the school, and a copy of it is on our website. Please take some time to review this handbook with your child(ren). The better school and family work together, the higher the chances of school success for students.

We are looking forward to another great year at CMS, and welcome parents to join us on this incredible journey of learning!

Safe Routes to School

We share this lot with the Kinder Korner Daycare, so we urge you to be especially careful on that lot and in the drop-off loop.

Our buses come to school along Brighton Lane, and will be part of the regular traffic pattern. As much as possible, please give buses preferential treatment around the school. Please exercise great caution as you travel around the school.



Religious Exercises 2014 -15

The Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has received petitions requesting that religious exercises be held in Clearspring Middle School during the 2014 – 15 school year.

The petitioners have specified their desire for the recitation of the Lord’s Prayer and the reading of a Bible passage or story from the Bible.

As the petition bears the signatures of parents representing more than 60 students in the school, the Board of Trustees of the

Hanover School Division has authorized religious exercises, as specified above, to be held before the official instructional day, from 9:00–9:05 a.m. in common areas in the school. Provincial and divisional guidelines will be followed. These guidelines are available from the school office, the division administration office, or on the web site at www.hsd.ca.

Only children of parents who have signed or joined the petition may participate. Parents may join the petition by forwarding a signed note to the school or to the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division indicating the name and the grade of the students they are signing for.

Religious Instruction 2014 -15

The Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has received petitions requesting that religious instruction be held in Clearspring Middle School during the 2014 – 15 school year.

The petitioners have specified their desire the Discovery Time program offered by Child Evangelism Fellowship.

As the petition bears the signatures of parents representing more than 25 students in the school, the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has passed the required by-law permitting religious instruction, as

specified above, to be offered by volunteers during designated half-hour per week classes.

Provincial and divisional guidelines will be followed. These guidelines are available from the school office, the division administration office, or on the web site at www.hsd.ca.

A French Moment: Improve Your Brain by Learning More Languages

You already know that keeping your brain active with crossword puzzles, Sudoku, and stimulating conversation all help to delay the start of degenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's. If you could take part in these engaging discussions and mental puzzles in ANOTHER language, you would be doing your brain an even bigger favour. It was a Canadian study that first proved that bilingualism plays the same role as doing puzzles in delaying the start of Alzheimer's disease.

Becoming fluent in another language actually increases the size of the brain's mighty cerebral cortex whose responsibilities cover not only memory but the ability to reason, plan, and process visual information. The brain's hippocampus, charged with helping long-term memories form, also becomes enlarged when a person learns another language. Learning another language also has distinct positive effects on a person's general intelligence and reading ability. This is due to the mental gymnastics a person experiences when searching for just the right word or phrase while working across multiple languages. Those who learn another language also see a boost to their creativity, empathy towards other cultures, and a better understanding of their own mother tongue.

Moreover, the advantages of learning another language are not limited to youth; science has proven that both brain structure and function benefit from learning a new language well into adulthood.

So, whether it's striving to remain mentally sharp or improving your memory and reading ability right now, learning another language is an effective way to nourish your brain.
