Principal's Message

CMS has been working to hear student voices on what is great about our school and what students would love to see us change to make the school better. Some things we do well are that our school looks, sounds, and feels happy. We have a great library, and students hear plenty of welcoming and encouraging words. Some things students said they thought would make our school better all linked to improving their sense of belonging. They suggested we add more clubs, which we did. It was not perfect, and we intend to improve it next year, but we were pleased with the results of this first response. Students asked us to help them address gossip and rude talk. We made these the focus of our Pink Shirt Day, and now have the results of that day posted around the school in the form of reminders to speak well of one another. Students asked us to consider purchasing more welcoming furniture. This will take a bit more time, but we are working on that. Students asked about getting more encouraging words around the school. We have purchased a vinyl cutter, and have begun the process of adding bright, encouraging messages around the school. This one could also take time, but our students will be part of the group that will make decisions about which messages we put up, and where we will put them.

Last week, Hanover School Division is inviting parents to add their voices to helping us know what we do well as a school, and what we can improve. We hope that all of our parents will contribute to that process. We continue to seek ways to be an exemplary middle school, and hope that your encouragement and comments can help us meet our goals.

We have had several highlights over the past month including a powerful performance by Robb Nash (Grade 7 and 8), internet safety presentations by the RCMP (Grade 7 and 8), a trip to the Human Rights Museum (Grade 7), Band trip to Edmonton (Grade 8), and we are beginning to have Grade 4 students visit as they prepare to become Grade 5 students at CMS next year.

With two months left in the school year, there are still many highlights to come. These include learning trips, Track and Field days, the Grade 8 Medieval Feast, Dragon Boat Races, and the Parent Advisory Council Barbeque on June 24th.
