## Mental Health Minute:

Students are exposed to new experiences daily and sometimes these new experiences can be overwhelming or even trigger feelings of anxiousness and worry. When students experience stressful or difficult situations it can often become a consuming thought or shift their whole day for the worse. Helping your child understand that new experiences can be challenging and exciting can help them take on new tasks with confidence. Assisting your child to shift their perspective to see that the problem was just a small portion of their day and that many awesome things still happened can help your child build resilience and confidence in managing tough experiences in the world. Ask your student, what is a bad day or just a bad moment?
